

Installation Guide

Before installation, please read this guide carefully.

- 1. We recommend that this product is installed by a qualified accredited tradesperson, Victorian Plumbing Ltd. accept no liability for products incorrectly installed, or where the correct testing procedures have not been adhered to, thus resulting in the escape of water and consequential damage.
- 2. Ensure the incoming mains water supply is switched off prior to commencing the installation.
- 3. Observe all local plumbing and building codes & regulations.
- 4. Carefully inspect the product for damage. If any damage is found, immediately contact our Customer Relations Team.

Operation notice:

- 1. The product is used between water pressure 0.5 to 4 bar, water temperature 0-90c.
- 2. The waste and the tap is suitable for being installed in the bathtub with a thickness around $5{\sim}15$ mm.
- 3. Read all the instructions completely before proceeding.

Fitting List:



- 1. Overflow/Spout/Control
- 2. Rubber Seal (Spout)
- 3. Overflow body
- 4. Elbow O-ring
- 5. Outlet elbow
- 6. PVC Hose
- 7. Hose nut
- 8. Rubber Seal Washer (Hose)
- 9. Waste body
- 10. Rubber Seal (Waste body)
- 11. Rubber washer (Flange)

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- 12. Flange
- 13. Pop-Up plug

Diagrams are for illustration purposes only. Your Bath filler/Overflow waste may superficially differ from this drawing however the installation guide steps still apply.

Waste Installation:



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Unscrew the cover cap on one side of the overflow body, then connect the outlet elbow and O-ring to the overflow body ensuring a tight seal. Place the rubber washer and the overflow body at the back of the bath and line up with the overflow hole. From the front of the bath, attach the spout to the overflow body





Attach the PVC hose to the waste body using the rubber seal and hose nut provided. Ensure that the connection has a tight seal, be careful not to over tighten.

Connect the outlet pipe from the valve to the Overflow body, then connect the waste trap to the waste body. Turn on the water supply, fill the bath with water and check all joints to ensure there are no leaks. This is the best done in stages starting with a small amount of water before fully filling the bath.

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Aftercare:

When installing or using tools, extra care must be taken to avoid damaging the finish or fitting. To maintain the appearance, please ensure it is cleaned regularly using a clean soft damp cloth only. Abrasive cleaners or detergents must not be used as they may cause surface deterioration.

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
